## James Madison (1751-1836)

**Highest Political Office:** President (1809-1817)

**Other Accomplishments:** Helped draft Virginia's state constitution when he was 25. That document later became the model for the U.S. Constitution. Served as Jefferson's Secretary of State.

Madison was a soft-spoken and tiny man—about 5'4" and less than 100 pounds. Even his nickname was diminutive: "Jemmy." He was too small to serve in the Revolutionary War, and turned to politics instead.

Madison, "the Father of the Constitution"—the most important legal document in modern history—never received a law degree. Even in his 40s, Madison was a lonely and single man. That changed when Aaron Burr introduced him to Dolley Todd. The couple married when Madison was 43, and never had children.

Dolley Madison earned a place in history when she stole away from the White House with crucial government documents and a portrait of George Washington as the British stormed the capital during the War of 1812.

Madison was the last Founding Father to die at the age of eighty-five in June, 1836.

## THE MOST COMPLEX STRUCTURE IN THE UNIVERSE

Whether you know it or not, you are the proud owner of the most complex arrangement of matter in the universe. I am speaking of your brain. Even though it weighs only three pounds, the brain's structure is so complex that it defies all explanation except to admit that a higher intelligence created it.

The average brain has ten billion neurons and multiple billions of connections.
